From Emmy-nominated Habitat Media (*Empty Oceans Empty Nets* and *Farming the Seas*) comes **PRICELE\$\$**, a film exploring the consequences of an electoral system that can obligate our leaders to the special interests bankrolling their election campaigns. The filmmakers follow a river of money through two national policies that affect the everyday lives of most citizens: agriculture & energy. In addition to time spent with farmers and an unusual group of Iraq War veterans, the filmmakers visit seasoned lawmakers, lobbyists and some dauntless citizen watchdogs while a classroom full of savvy civics students provide comic relief. PRICELE\$\$ also takes a behind-the-scenes look at Arizona's road-test of an electoral reform that some observers believe can free Congress from the corrosive influence of big-money donors and lobbyists. Narrated by filmmaker Steve Cowan, PRICELE\$\$ was made on location in Washington D.C., New York, Florida, Kansas, Iowa, Wyoming, Arizona, California and Oregon.

#### Director's Statement

Our non-partisan film is meant for the many citizens we've met coast-to-coast who love their country but who say they don't feel represented—people too busy making a living or raising their families to watch what goes on in our nation's capitol. People who know something is wrong with our democracy, but don't know exactly where the problem is or how to fix it. How can it be that year after year, despite clear signs of serious dangers associated with our national farm (food) and energy policies, Congress continues to direct massive subsidies to technologies that seriously threaten our long-term well being? We have attempted to provide a non-partisan, unfiltered look at the root of this dysfunction—business-as-usual campaign finance in Washington D.C. where high-stake donors and lobbyists have daily access to powerful members of Congress. I hope that our film also helps viewers see that this seemingly overwhelming problem can indeed be fixed if we-the-people simply demand a better way of electing our leaders.

<u>Mike Conaway (R)</u> - Current U.S. Representative for 11th congressional district of Texas, serving since 2005. Also serves on the House Committee on Agriculture.



<u>Mario Cuomo (D)</u> - Served as the 52nd Governor of the state of New York from 1983 to 1994.



<u>Dick Durbin (D)</u> – Current senior U.S. Senator from Illinois and Democratic Party Whip. Serving as a Member of Congress since 1982.

Dan Maffei (D) - Former U.S. Democratic Representative for New York's 25<sup>th</sup> district.




<u>Eric Massa</u> (D) - Former U.S. Representative from New York's 29th Congressional District, serving from January 2009 until his resignation in March 2010


